In the 2021-2022 school year, TPRI scores were lower in all grade levels Kindergarten-2nd grade. There were no students on our campus scheduled to take TELPAS this year. STAAR Alternate 2 was administered to 4 students on the campus. All students passed the assessment in all areas. Mrs. Flusche, Mrs. Hofbauer, Mrs. Melton, and Ms. Robinson administered the CIRCLE assessment to all students in PPCD, 3K, Pre-K at the beginning, middle, and end of year. The TEMI was given to all students in Kindergarten, 1st grade, and 2nd grade at the beginning, middle, and end of the year. STAR Math and STAR Reading assessments were given to all students each six weeks to measure growth in state standards. The BOY assessments were administered online to students in grades 3-6. Students in grades 3-6 will take the online Interim assessments as a benchmark test in November and February. Students in grades K-6 were enrolled in Progress Learning. The program gives students a placement test and then allows teachers to assign assignments or students to work on individual areas of need.

Students are pulled 1-2 days per week. Students are also served in the regular education classroom. Saint Jo Elementary provides multiple opportunities for parental involvement. There is at least one parental involvement activity scheduled per month outside the school day. Saint Jo Elementary hosts parent/teacher conferences after the 1st six weeks of school each year. Parents come to the classroom to visit with the teacher and look at student progress. Saint Jo Elementary School offers a free full day Pre-K program to all 4 year old students in Saint Jo ISD. Transfers may be accepted on a limited basis depending on numbers. Saint Jo Elementary School offers a full day 3K program for 3 year old students. The group plans and organizes activities such as Fall Fest, Goodies with Grandparents, Muffins with Mom, and Donuts with Dad Saint Jo Elementary has monthly faculty meetings to go over important information and updates. Saint Jo Elementary has a Campus Site-Based Team that meets periodically throughout the year along with the district site-based team. Teacher members are elected by campus staff.
